Regular Board News Release

Prior to the regular board meeting Mrs. Kimberly Chowning, Treasurer, discussed the use of federal Special Education IDEA Part B funds and Title funds for the annual requirement.

During the regular school board meeting Mrs. Chowning presented and discussed her synopsis regarding the five year forecast.

Mr. John Siegrist presented to the board the possibility of adding an indoor Archery Club as a club sport. Mr. Siegrist stated he was going to reach out to Pheasants Forever, Ducks Unlimited and local wildlife groups to generate support and/or sponsorship. He concluded by stating this program would be good for those students who do not participate in other extracurricular activities. The archery club would run from the middle of January to spring.

Mr. Shane Mead, Elementary Principal, began by stating he had positive feedback from staff and parents on the smooth start to the year. We had a lot of personnel changes but we are off and running. To date the elementary has 423 students enrolled. Again, this year we will have multiple teachers taking advantage of professional development.

Mr. Mead shared the preliminary aggregate results for our local MAP assessments. Students who require reading improvements and monitoring plans (RIMPs) based on local data will receive the necessary intervention beginnign as soon as possible. Parents will receive notification this week.

On September 30, the Darke County Center for the Arts in Education will present to all students in kindergarten through third grade on the Underground Railroad . Fire Prevention Program will be held on October 8, 2015. Lunch with the Principal and Patriot of the Month will start in October. The elementary fundraiser kickoff was held on September $11^{\rm th}$.

Sign-ups were held on Wednesday September 23 from 3:00-5:30. Cookies and punch for the Dads signing up will be provided. It is a very tight schedule this year. Mr. Lee Morris, JH/HS Principal, distributed enrollment numbers of students in grades seven through twelve, including the students who are taking college credit plus classes.

We are pleased to announce the addition of a mobile computer lab housed with 16 Google Chromebook for the 2015-2016 year. These are utilized by both blended learning students as well as college credit plus students. Mr. Morris publically thanked Mr. John Lay, IT Coordinator for his work on setting up the mobile lab.

This year the STEM lab houses three different teachers working out of the lab every day. Mrs. Gutierrez, Mr. Kowalski and Mr. Lowrie are all teaching courses based out of the STEM lab and there is still room for more growth. This year the students transitioned from block scheduling to an eight period day, Mr. Morris stated he has only heard positive comments from both staff and students. Mr. Morris is pleased with the eleven new high school course offerings and three CCP offerings for this year. (Ceramics, Art 1, World Geography, Geology, Drama, Sports Management, Personal Finance, French I, JH Drawing, JH Word Processing, Weightlifting. CCP: College Algebra, Communications and Anatomy & Physiology.)

Energy Optimizers improvements in lighting through the school building have been very impressive. The new art room has opened, the kiln room is also beginning to take shape nicely.

Mr. Morris and the Safety Team reported the first safety drill was a successful one. Everything went very well.

Mr. Morris was excited to unveil a bench project in the memorial garden. The following groups and individuals have joined together to spearhead this endeavor.
