Regular Board News Release
August 27, 2018

The Tri-Village Local School District Board of Education met in regular session on Monday, August 27, 2018 at 6:00 p.m. with the following members present: Tim Bevins, Shane Coby, Amy Farmer, Tracy Frech and Tom Schlechty. Josh Sagester, Kimberly Chowning, Lee Morris and Shane Mead were in attendance as well. The minutes of the regular and special meeting for July 30, 2018 were approved. The members also approved the July 2018 expenditures, current appropriation budget amendments and all financial reports as presented by the Treasurer.

Elementary Principal: Mr. Mead shared new plans for the elementary PBIS (positive behavioral interventions and supports) rewards system for the upcoming year. Ms. Keen, Mrs. Munchel and Mrs. Lefeld are volunteering their time and efforts to continuously improve the PBIS efforts. Last school year, the elementary presented patriot bucks, patriot buck assemblies, patriot of the month, lunch with the principal and patriot postcards for positive behavior. In addition, ideas for this year include weekly patriot buck drawings, quarterly dances for the class with the most patriot bucks, music at lunch on Friday's for good lunch behavior and dodgeball Friday. The staff will be included in the PBIS events as well this year. Staff will be allowed to wear jeans on payday Friday's only rather than every Friday as in the past. Mr. Mead also shared his staff's professional development meeting agenda with the Board members which took place on August 27.

High School Principal: Mr. Morris introduced his new staff members for the upcoming school year. Mr. Craig Alliston, JH/HS Intervention Specialist, was present. Other new hires include Mr. Laden Delawder, JH/HS Intervention Specialist and Mr. Mark Moses, paraprofessional classroom aide. Mr. Zach Stahl will also be present as a student teacher for Mr. Judy. Mr. Morris also shared his August 27 staff meeting agenda with the board members as well as the 2018-2019 JH/HS building goals.

Superintendent Report: Mr. Sagester reported that the staff professional development days were received with much excitement. As of August 27, 385 students are enrolled in the JH/HS building and 412 in the elementary. Open enrollment numbers include 178 students entering the District and 57 leaving to be educated elsewhere. Legislative activity included summaries on House Bill 87 and 318 and Senate Bill 216. Over 220 families attended the JH/HS chromebook instructional sessions. Those students who did not attend will need to attend a session with the Technology Coordinator and Mr. Morris prior to receiving their device. Currently, there are no students enrolled in the blended learning academy. However, 27 part time and 7 full time students are enrolled in Edison Community College's college credit plus program and 2 part time students are enrolled at Sinclair Community College. Nineteen students have enrolled in the ACT Prep course which is offered on the District's campus. Mr. Sagester shared a list of names of new teachers for the 2018-2019 school year. The elementary staff members include Abigail O'Donnell (Intervention Specialist), Julie Bell (Second grade) and Alexis Hartzell (Title I). High school staff members include Craig Alliston and Laden Delawder, both Intervention Specialists. The District employs 53 certified staff members with the following levels of education: 5 achieving a bachelor's degree, 10 with a bachelor's degree + 15, 19 with a Masters, 11 with a Masters plus 15 additional hours and 8 with a Masters plus 30 additional hours of education. Mary Boone has resigned her position as Bus Driver. Jeanette Leugers has been hired to replace Mary. The District will be adding a community bus stop around the Snack Shop area to pick up students residing on Anderson Street. A safety patrol program will be instituted this year under the supervision of Deputy Garbig. He along with teachers will select up to 10 trustworthy and dependable sixth grade students to take part with parent consent. The equipment that will be used for the program has already been received from AAA. It is the hope of the District that this program will increase student safety on the sidewalks as they travel to and from school. Mr. Sagester publically thanked the summer maintenance crew for their efforts in cleaning the building and maintaining the grounds. Extracurricular fall sports numbers were shared. Total fall participants include 194 students which equates to 64% of our JH/HS student population. Congratulations to all cheerleaders and advisors for earning first place in all categories at the Darke County Fair.
