Thank you for taking the time and effort to provide feedback to the Tri-Village School District. We value the community's guidance. The School Board and Administration are seeking opinions on how best to keep the district on sound financial footing. Over the last eight years, the district has maintained a positive carry-over, but it has not been easy. Tough decisions were made with the result being a reduction in teaching and nonteaching staff. Over the last ten years 7.5 teaching positions were eliminated and 8 nonteaching positions were eliminated. By reducing staff and freezing salaries the last two years, the district has remained in the black on an annual basis. However, this is not a strategy that the district can continue to use. because salaries must remain competitive and larger class sizes are not desirable. The district was also fortunate that insurance premiums actually decreased last year. This is truly atypical as that had never occurred in the district's history. To summarize, the district's ability to continue to contain expenses is going to be difficult. Building expenses will certainly increase, health insurance will increase, and Tri-Village employees need to be adequately paid. The revenue side of the equation is even less clear. The current state budget will sunset on June 30, 2013. The state revenues were flat funded in some areas and even reduced in other areas. For instance, tangible personal property was phased out, and the Department of Taxation ruled in favor of the gas companies with gas lines in the district that reduced their tax rates, thus resulting in less revenue for the district. The new state budget must be in place by July 1, 2013. Early indications are that schools should expect to see further cuts to their budgets.
