Students will be taking the spring Ohio Achievement Assessments over the next two weeks. During the day of their assessment the teaching staff will be serving breakfast to the students.

Students will participate in Cedar Point Math and Science Days on May 14-15, 2014.

Kelsey Timmerman, author of "Where am I Wearing," will be with us on Thursday May 15, 2014. He will give a general presentation to the entire 7-12 student body concerning ideas from his book and life experiences early in the day. Thank you to Mr. John Beard for organizing his visit.

On April 5 and 6, 2014, the dinner theatre 'Amore' performed and was once again a huge success. Congratulations to Mrs. Geneva Price, Miss Emily Venneman, their students, and all the volunteers who created a wonderful program.

Thanks to the high school student council for organizing and holding a community blood drive on April 9, 2014. Thirty-six participants donated blood.

Sergeant Michael Lewis and Officer Robert Reigle visited the campus to see if there was a way to improve traffic patterns after school in the parking lot and on the playground. They are seeking ways to become more involved in school daily operations.

We are happy to report that we raised \$1,534.13 for the Pennies for Patients Drive. This was sponsored by the National Honor Society.

Mr. Josh Sagester, Superintendent was pleased to report the closeout calculator for the building project is near completion. Mr. Sagester commended Mrs. Kimberly Chowning, Treasurer for a job well done.

Freshman orientation took place on April 8, 2014. Thank you to Mrs. Annette Black, Guidance Counselor and Mr. Morris for organizing this event.

Mr. Sagester discussed how the extended days were going. It is great to get the extended days in before the Ohio Achievement Testing begins.

Mr. Hollinger, Transportation Supervisor reported to Mr. Sagester that the State Highway Patrol inspection went well. All our buses passed inspection with zero red flags. Mr. Sagester commended Mr. Hollinger on keeping the buses road ready.

Mr. Sagester gave a brief legislative update and a third grade reading guarantee update. Currently students in the third grade will need to score a 392 on the Spring OAA or a 190 on the Summer MAP assessment. Mr. Mead is looking at some potential summer school options for students who need more intervention in grades 2 and 3.

Mr. Sagester was pleased to report that the final paperwork to begin processing new computers for our high school lab has been completed. The lab will be enhanced for the 2014-2015 PARCC assessments. This will give the district approximately 100 total hard wired desk-top computers in the district to use for testing.

Fifty students from Miami, Darke, and Champaign Counties competed in the Ohio Academy of Science West District Science Day, held at Central State University, Wilberforce, Ohio on Saturday, March 22, 2014. Over 460 students from seven counties participated in the all day event. Gage Berghoff and Casey Puckett received a superior rating. Emma Campbell, Keenan Fraylick, and Katelyn Hanes received an excellent rating. Keenan received a special award: CSU Biological Society Award, Southwest Ohio Water Environment Association Award and Stockholm Junior Water Prize Regional

Award. Gage & Casey received the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers Dayton Section Award. Of the nineteen students receiving superior ratings at the District Science Day, thirteen were selected to proceed to the State Science Day held at The Ohio State University on May 10, 21014 where 4.5 million in scholarships and special awards will be presented.

The Math Night Carnival was a huge success. "This is a phenomenal evening for our students and parents. I would like to publically thank Mrs. Bergman and host of other teachers for organizing our event. I would also like to thank the many staff members who volunteered their services as well," stated Mr. Sagester.

Mr. Sagester commended Mr. Brian Pohlman and his FFA students for their outstanding job at the annual FFA Banquet.

On behalf of Matt Fraylick, the district will be receiving an IBM grant in the amount of \$2,000 to be split between the STEM and MH programs.

On Thursday April 10, the district hosted Capital City Percussion, and instrumental group from Columbus, Ohio. They were in town for the winter Guard International WGI World Championships, which took place at the University of Dayton Arena, April 11-13, 2014.

Mr. Sagester congratulated Mrs. Karen Friar for being honored as the Teacher of the Year for Tri-Village. The Darke County Retired Teachers Association will recognize her at the yearend banquet.
