WOAC Ticket Pricing

As some of you may have seen, the WOAC recently made a change to ticket pricing for athletic events as a result of Ohio House Bill 147 that was passed. Here are what those changes look like:

- These prices became effective as of the WINTER SPORTS season.
- ALL High School and Middle School athletic events at all WOAC schools will be:
 - Adult price of \$7
 - Student price of \$5
 - Senior Citizen (age 62+) price of \$5
- This is again for all ticketed events. which will also now include Baseball and Softball.

Family All Sports Passes and Adult All Sports Passes are now only purchased online on our website through Home Town Ticketing. To access, go to the TV Athletics website: https://trivillagepatriots.com/

From here, click on the "More" tab, and then on "Tickets". Scroll to bottom of page for 2024-2025 Passes, click on "Get Passes" button. From this page, you will have the options to purchase Family All Sports Passes or Adult All Sports Passes in the quantity you would like. Please understand, there is a processing charge of \$4.88.

ARCHERY TOURNAMENTS

Jack Ferguson Tournament

The Tri-Village Junior High and High School Archery Teams traveled to Tri-County North High School to compete in the Jack Ferguson Tournament on Saturday, February 22nd, 2025.

The junior high team ended the tournament with a team score of 3132. Tri-Village Junior High team had 5 kids place individually. For the boys overall, Wyatt Blanton placed 1st with a score of 280, Anthony Moore placed 2nd with a score of 266, and Dallas Grow placed 3rd with a score of 265. Overall for the girls, Lillian Case placed 2nd with a score of 278 and Issabell Meade placed 3rd with a score of 265.

The high school team ended the tournament with a team score of 3257. The Tri-Village High School team had 4 kids place individually. For the boys overall, Kyan Leonard placed 1st with a score of 279. Overall for the girls, Alivia Allen placed 1st with a score of 280, Addison Meade placed 2nd with a score of 277, and Alex Begoon placed 3rd with a score of 275.





Ohio Bullseye Championship

On Saturday, March 8th and Sunday, March 9th, 2025 the Tri-Village Archery Teams traveled to Columbus to the state fair grounds for the Ohio Bullseye State Archery tournament. There were eighty-eight teams that competed from elementary through high school levels.

The Tri-Village Junior High team placed 13th out of 30 with a team score of 3098. This score qualifies our Junior High team for Nationals.

The high school team placed 6th out of 33 with a team score of 3262. These students did a tremendous job, as the scores from 2nd to 6th place were separated by only 12 points. The high school team's score qualifies them for Nationals.

Nationals are held in Louisville, Kentucky, May 8th-10th, 2025.




Key Club sold homemade Shamrock Shakes in celebration of St. Patrick's Day. There were great reviews! All proceeds will be donated to sponsor a local charity.



General Guidelines for Keeping Children Home from School Due to Illness

It is sometimes difficult to decide when and how long to keep an ill child home from school. The timing of the absence is often important in order to decrease the spread of disease to others and to prevent your child from acquiring any other illness while his/her resistance is lowered. The following guidelines represent the more common childhood illnesses and the usual recommendations of the Ohio Department of Health.

CHICKEN POX: Your child should remain home until all blisters have scabbed over, usually 6 days after the appearance of the first crop of blisters.

COMMON COLD: Your child should remain home if symptoms are serious enough to interfere with your child's ability to learn.

FEVER: If your child's temperature is 100 degrees Fahrenheit or greater he/she should remain home until he/she has been fever-free (without the use of fever-reducing medicine) for a full 24 hours. Remember fever is symptom indicating the presence of an illness.

FLU: Abrupt onset of fever, chills, headache and sore muscles. Your child should remain home from school until symptoms are gone and the child is without a fever for 24 hours.

HEAD LICE: Following lice infestation, please accompany your child to school the morning after receiving treatment. The school nurse or trained staff will check to make sure there are no live bugs and that progress has been made in removing nits.

IMPETIGO: Your child should remain home from school until receiving 24 hours of antibiotic therapy and sores are no longer draining.

PAIN: If your child complains, or behavior indicates, that he/she is experiencing persistent pain, he/she should be evaluated by a physician before your child is sent to school.

PINKEYE: Your child should remain home from school until receiving 24 hours of antibiotic therapy and discharge from the eye has stopped.

SKIN RASHES: Skin rashes of unknown origin should be evaluated by a physician before your child goes to school.

STREP THROAT AND SCARLET FEVER: Your child should remain home from school until receiving a full 24 hours of antibiotic therapy and until he/she is without fever or vomiting for 24 hours.

VOMITING AND DIARRHEA: Your child should remain at home until vomiting, diarrhea or fever has ceased for a full 24 hours. If your child has had any of these symptoms during the night he/she should not be sent to school the following day.
