Board News Release

The Tri-Village Board of Education met on Monday, December 15, 2014 at 6:00 in the board office.

Mr. Shane Mead, Elementary Principal shared he has six remaining OTES (Ohio Teacher Evaluation System) formal observations to complete for the first round of observations.

All kindergarten, $1^{\rm st}$ grade and $2^{\rm nd}$ grade teachers will participate in IMPACT (primary math training) training this year. (Mathematics Professional Development) This training will assist us in gaining a better sense of geometry and measurements, all teachers will be attending. Joan Smith the professional development coordinator for mathematics from teaching and learning collaborative out of Columbus will be on campus to teach a lesson while our teachers observe her on January $7^{\rm th}$.

Mr. Mead briefed the board on the third grade reading guarantee (TGRG) update. The fall testing indicated we were 54% proficient, Five students who were on RIMPs passed, four students were placed on a RIMP due to their scores, with eleven students possible being retained. The winter MAP testing results are in which we use as our alternative testing for the TGRG, the students tested very well and only have a possibility of retaining three students. Those students will have two more opportunities in the Spring to meet the TGRG requirements.

Starting after school on January 5, 2015 Mr. Mead is offering a Reading and Math Intervention training. Letters were sent home to identified students in each grade level. The intervention hours will be from 2:45 - 3:45 Monday - Thursday. The training will be all computer based and held in our elementary computer lab.

During the December $10^{\rm th}$ early release K-2 staff members participated in W.E.P. (Written Educational Plan) training to better service our gifted students in the primary grades.

Congratulations to Tori Richards, 4th grade student for winning the Spelling Bee for the second year in a row and will complete at the County Spelling Bee on January 22^{nd} at Mississinawa Valley Local Schools.

The fall fundraiser limo ride and pizza party was held on December 5th. There were 47 students who sold at least 15 items in the fall fundraiser to earn the limo ride and pizza party on December 5th. Congratulations and thank you to the students who earned the limo ride and party.

Mr. Lee Morris, JH/HS Principal, discussed the MAP Testing for the junior high and high school. This year the students were given index result cards so they could record their test score, allowing them to see their progress from the fall to spring testing periods. Now they have a more tangible goal to reach. Mr. Morris and Mr. Welbaum created a MAP schedule to test all junior high students at the same time in our computer labs, this was to maximize the system capabilities and building efficiency.

Mr. Morris shared a book list that the students are reading throughout the building, while he was doing his classroom visits.

Along with Edison State, other universities will be rolling out their college plus options. Miami University,

The goal for college credit plus is to try to create a head start career path for high school students who have an idea of what they want to do to get them started on their path for a college diploma.
