# A Couple of Important Reminders and Tips:

## Morning Drop Offs:

If you are walking your student into school, you cannot park in the car line. You must park in the visitor parking. The car line in front of the school is a drop off lane ONLY. We have several staff that are out there in the mornings to greet and monitor students to ensure they get into the buildings safely. If you feel the need to come into the school with your student, please park in the visitor parking.

## One Call Issues:

For the issue with contacts not receiving calls, that could be related to several factors, such as:

- Call Forwarding / Call filtering / Call blocking / Call screening (via phone provider, phone settings, or mobile apps)
- Caller ID settings (both for your One Call Now account and the contact member(s))
- Phone signal or coverage area issues with Mobile Carriers or Landline Providers
- Wi-Fi Connections (being connected to a Wi-Fi network)
- Voicemail settings

The default number might be getting flagged/filtered as spam or spam risk through the service provider of the contacts in question. We suggest two things: for mobile devices, have the recipient save the Default Caller ID number (877-698-3261) and your organization's Caller ID number (937-996-1511) into their contact list, that way it does not get flagged as such, or, for landline numbers, they can call their provider and let them know that all calls coming from these numbers should be allowed and not considered spam.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

I hope this message finds you well. As we navigate through our lovely Ohio winter weather, we want to keep you informed about the possibility of utilizing our Continuity of Learning Plan (online learning plan) if the district **exceeds five calamity days**. Due to the passage of legislation last year, districts must utilize an online learning plan that replaces the use of blizzard bags. Once the district exhausts the five allotted missed school days, the Continuity of Learning Plan will be used for days six, seven and eight if need be. Any school days missed after that will result in days being made up which are defined on our Board adopted calendar. To date, the district has utilized two calamity days due to inclement weather.

### **What are online days?**

Online day plans are an alternative to making up hours due to school closures. Districts may use an online day plan to make up the equivalent of up to **three school days** via online delivery under allowable circumstances.

### **Continuity of Learning Plan for Tri-Village (online days)**

1. The teaching staff will use Google Meets/Google Classroom to provide online instruction to our students.
  - a. Students will follow their regular class schedule online by clicking each individual teacher link if warranted.
    - i. Each teacher will communicate their individual plan with students/parents.
2. Attendance will be taken based on completion of assignment(s) and/or participation.
3. Our teaching staff will be accessible through their individual link on our district website from 7:40 am-3:00 pm.
4. Students will use their own device and/or a district issued Chromebook for technology access.
  - a. Students who do not have access (technology/internet) will be given the assignment upon their return to school however, the expectation is that students make every attempt to be present online.
5. The district will use our various social media outlets and our one call now information system to inform parents when our Continuity of Learning Plan will be enacted.

We appreciate your continued support, understanding, and most importantly your patience as we navigate this modification. If you have questions, feel free to reach out to our building principals and/or your child's teacher.

# General Guidelines for Keeping Children Home from School Due to Illness

It is sometimes difficult to decide when and how long to keep an ill child home from school. The timing of the absence is often important in order to decrease the spread of disease to others and to prevent your child from acquiring any other illness while his/her resistance is lowered. The following guidelines represent the more common childhood illnesses and the usual recommendations of the Ohio Department of Health.

**CHICKEN POX:** Your child should remain home until all blisters have scabbed over, usually 6 days after the appearance of the first crop of blisters.

**COMMON COLD:** Your child should remain home if symptoms are serious enough to interfere with your child's ability to learn.

**FEVER:** If your child's temperature is 100 degrees Fahrenheit or greater he/she should remain home until he/she has been fever-free (without the use of fever-reducing medicine) for a full 24 hours. Remember fever is symptom indicating the presence of an illness.

**FLU:** Abrupt onset of fever, chills, headache and sore muscles. Your child should remain home from school until symptoms are gone and the child is without a fever for 24 hours.

**HEAD LICE:** Following lice infestation, please accompany your child to school the morning after receiving treatment. The school nurse or trained staff will check to make sure there are no live bugs and that progress has been made in removing nits.

**IMPETIGO:** Your child should remain home from school until receiving 24 hours of antibiotic therapy and sores are no longer draining.

**PAIN:** If your child complains, or behavior indicates, that he/she is experiencing persistent pain, he/she should be evaluated by a physician before your child is sent to school.

**PINKEYE:** Your child should remain home from school until receiving 24 hours of antibiotic therapy and discharge from the eye has stopped.

**SKIN RASHES:** Skin rashes of unknown origin should be evaluated by a physician before your child goes to school.

**STREP THROAT AND SCARLET FEVER:** Your child should remain home from school until receiving a full 24 hours of antibiotic therapy and until he/she is without fever or vomiting for 24 hours.

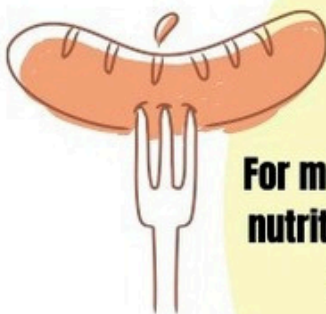
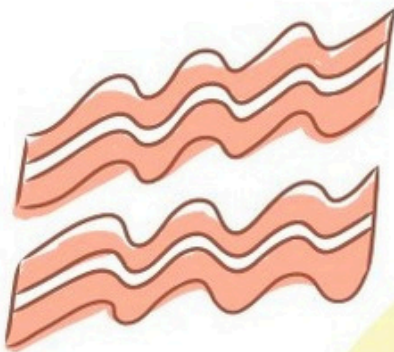
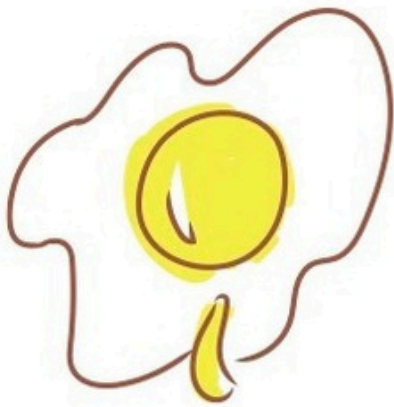
**VOMITING AND DIARRHEA:** Your child should remain at home until vomiting, diarrhea or fever has ceased for a full 24 hours. If your child has had any of these symptoms during the night he/she should not be sent to school the following day.
