Interested in Hosting an Exchange Student?

Have you ever had an interest in learning more about another country? One way to do that is by hosting a high school exchange student. By opening your home to a student from another country you have the opportunity to create an international friendship for a lifetime. The exchange students attend school as a normal student, come with personal spending money and insurance. Host families are asked to take them in as a member of your family and provide three meals/day.

Am I a good host family candidate?

Are you over 25 years of age and do you have a:

- > Welcoming attitude
- > Desire to make a positive impact in a child's life
- > The wish to exchange cultures
- > And room for another household member?

If so, **you are the perfect candidate!**

Who are the successful families?

Our host families come from all over the United States and represent the diversity that the country is known for. **Families with children, families without children, empty nesters, and single individuals** have all had successful hosting experiences.

What are ISE exchange students like?

ISE exchange students **speak English**, they are **15-18-year-old** high school students **from over 40 countries around the world**. Program acceptance is based on their English skills, demeanor, adaptability, and eagerness to experience American culture.

Are students treated like "guests"?

No, ISE exchange **students expect to live as members of your family**. They respect family rules, help with chores, and participate in family gatherings and activities.

How long does the program last?

Programs run for **5, 10, or 12 months**. The 5-month programs can start in either August or January, the 10-month program begins in August, and the 12-month program begins in January.

What if there is an issue or emergency?

If a problem arises, **your representative is there to help you solve it**. ISE also employs full-time support staff at our headquarters and operates a 24/7 hotline for students and families for additional assistance.

Do families get paid for hosting?

No, all of our **host families are volunteers**. Families are eligible for a tax deduction for hosting a student. If you are looking for paid opportunities, consider becoming an Area Representative.

What are host families responsible for?

- > A bed and a place to study
- > Three meals a day
- > A nurturing environment to learn about American culture and to share their own.

ISE exchange **students arrive with their own money** for personal expenses, social outings, and other activities. Host families are not required to provide any cash allowance.

Who covers student's medical bills?

ISE exchange students arrive with **their own insurance**. Any costs incurred by the student for medical care is the responsibility of the student's natural parents or the student's sponsoring agency.

Can I host more than one student?

Yes. Some families prefer the experience of hosting two students at a time. To host two students, the **students must come from different countries and speak different native languages**.

How do I become a host family?

- > Get in touch with our representative (information below) or fill out an interest form on our website.
- > Next our representative will invite you to **complete our online host family application** that will help us learn more about your family lifestyle, and household.

Because the safety of our program participants is our highest priority, our host families must also pass a background check and home check.

When is the application deadline?

ASAP - the earlier you apply, the more likely it is that you'll find a compatible student in your area.

WOAC Cheer Competition




Our Junior High and High School Cheer teams participated in the WOAC Cheer Championship on Sunday, December 8th.

6th Annual Annual Iron Eagle Classic Powerlifting Meet


The Tri-Village Boys Powerlifting Team participated in the 6th Annual Iron Eagle Classic at Madison Plains High School on Dec. 14th.

There were 15 schools that participated and around 400 lifters. This was a High School meet for 9-12th graders. Our Boys Team placed 6th overall. Hayden Crawford, Shaun Crawford and Aiden Crumley placed 1st in their divisions. Owen Walker and Cameron Kimmel placed 3rd and Mavin Robinson placed 4th in their divisions. Hayden Crawford tied the meet bench press record at 200 lbs. and set a new Dead Lift record at 315 lbs.. He also set a new overall total of 515 lbs. in his weight class. Shaun Crawford set a new meet Bench Press record at 295 lbs. and a new overall total of 720 lbs. in the 155 lb. weight class. Calvin Fritz (Valley View High School) a former TV Lifter placed 4th in the 250 lb. class.

The Tri-Village Girls Powerlifting Team participated in the 6th Annual Iron Eagle Classic at the Madison Plains High School. The girls team placed 5th overall. There were 15 schools represented and around 400 lifters. Ashtyn Robinson, Zoe Ayette and Kaitlynn Brewster placed 1st in their weight class/division. From here, click on the "More" tab, and then on "Tickets". Scroll to bottom of page for 2024-2025 Passes, click on "Get Passes" button. From this page, you will have the options to purchase Family All Sports Passes or Adult All Sports Passes in the quantity you would like. Please understand, there is a processing charge of \$4.88.

General Guidelines for Keeping Children Home from School Due to Illness

It is sometimes difficult to decide when and how long to keep an ill child home from school. The timing of the absence is often important in order to decrease the spread of disease to others and to prevent your child from acquiring any other illness while his/her resistance is lowered. The following guidelines represent the more common childhood illnesses and the usual recommendations of the Ohio Department of Health.

CHICKEN POX: Your child should remain home until all blisters have scabbed over, usually 6 days after the appearance of the first crop of blisters.

COMMON COLD: Your child should remain home if symptoms are serious enough to interfere with your child's ability to learn.

FEVER: If your child's temperature is 100 degrees Fahrenheit or greater he/she should remain home until he/she has been fever-free (without the use of fever-reducing medicine) for a full 24 hours. Remember fever is symptom indicating the presence of an illness.

FLU: Abrupt onset of fever, chills, headache and sore muscles. Your child should remain home from school until symptoms are gone and the child is without a fever for 24 hours.

HEAD LICE: Following lice infestation, please accompany your child to school the morning after receiving treatment. The school nurse or trained staff will check to make sure there are no live bugs and that progress has been made in removing nits.

IMPETIGO: Your child should remain home from school until receiving 24 hours of antibiotic therapy and sores are no longer draining.

PAIN: If your child complains, or behavior indicates, that he/she is experiencing persistent pain, he/she should be evaluated by a physician before your child is sent to school.

PINKEYE: Your child should remain home from school until receiving 24 hours of antibiotic therapy and discharge from the eye has stopped.

SKIN RASHES: Skin rashes of unknown origin should be evaluated by a physician before your child goes to school.

STREP THROAT AND SCARLET FEVER: Your child should remain home from school until receiving a full 24 hours of antibiotic therapy and until he/she is without fever or vomiting for 24 hours.




VOMITING AND DIARRHEA: Your child should remain at home until vomiting, diarrhea or fever has ceased for a full 24 hours. If your child has had any of these symptoms during the night he/she should not be sent to school the following day.
