

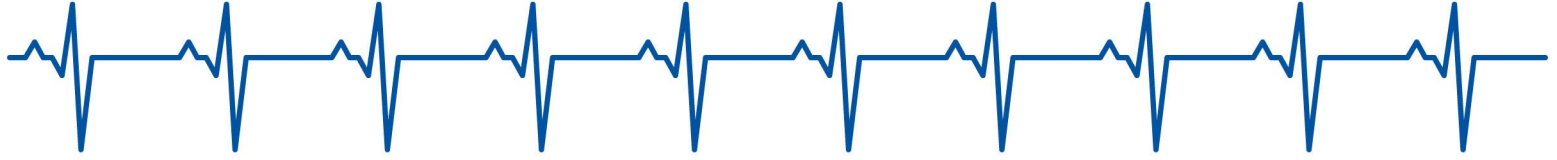

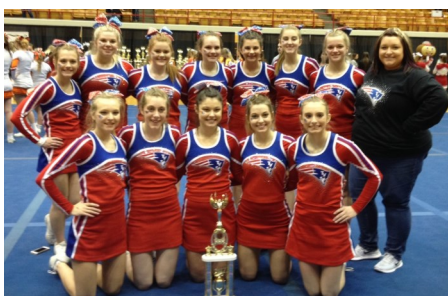

The cheerleaders had a great season of competition that sent them back to back to the OASSA Cheer State Championships.



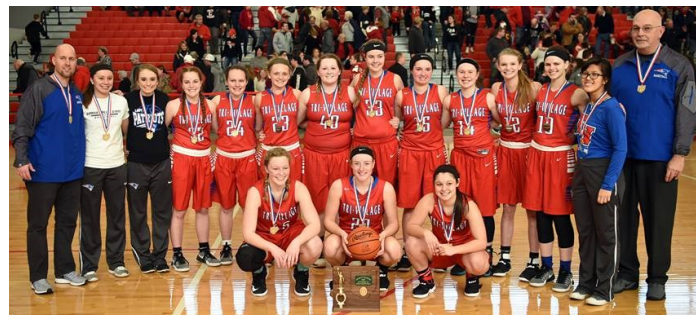
Destination Imagination

On March 18, the Tri-Village Destination Imagination middle and secondary level teams placed first at their regional tournament. The teams will travel to Mount Vernon, Ohio on April 8 to perform at the state competition. If the either team places in the top three within their challenge, they will compete at Global Finals in May. The middle level team includes: Dylan Finkbine, Andrew Holsapple, Matthew Holzapfel, Jacob Siegreest, and Johnna Siegreest. The secondary level team includes: Emma Campbell, Shelby Holzapfel, Kaylor Pearson, and Makenzie Stucky. Kathy Pearson volunteers as team manager for both teams.

Destination Imagination is an internationally renowned, student lead program that encourages young people to use their creative thinking, problem solving, and teamwork skills to overcome a variety of academic challenges. At each competition, teams participate in an instant challenge and showcase their central challenge. During the instant challenge, the team is presented a problem that they do not know prior to entering the challenge area. They must solve the problem

“instantly” in front of a panel of judges. Months prior to competing, teams are given a central challenge. Teams must prepare to perform an improvisational skit for an audience and appraisers. The team is scored on the success and creativity of their instant and central challenges.

Emma, Shelby, Kaylor, and Makenzie have participated in Destination Imagination for nine years as a team. The girls have placed first at regionals and have competed at state every year. The team (including other members) competed at Global Finals in 2009 and 2012. Since this is the team's last year they are hoping to finish their career with a final trip to Globals.
