

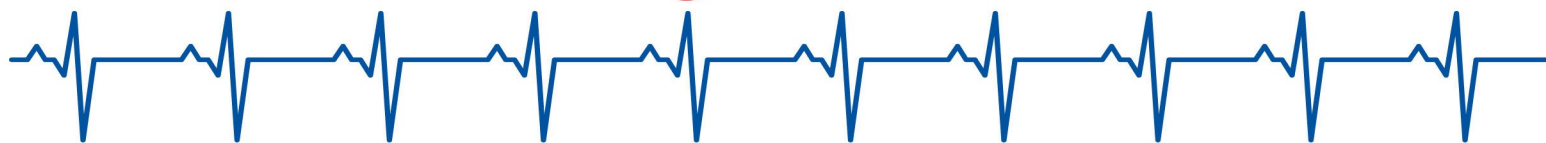

New Ohio immunization requirements for all students entering 7th & 12th grade this Fall:

Junior High School

Those entering 7th grade will now need a Meningococcal vaccine in addition to a Tdap (Tetanus Diphtheria and Pertussis) vaccine. These vaccines should be received and a copy provided to the school nurse or secretary **by the first day of school**. Vaccines are available at the Darke County Health Department on Tuesdays from 8-10:30 am and 2-5:00pm. Clinics are walk-in/no appointment needed during these hours. Medicaid and most health insurance are accepted. For more information, questions, or concerns: please call the Health Department at 548-4196 ext. 224. Many of our local doctors also provide vaccines by appointment. Please check with your doctor for more information on this.

High School

Those entering 12th grade will now need a Meningococcal vaccine prior to the first day of school this fall. Students must be 16 or older at the time of vaccination to meet this requirement. These vaccines should be received and a copy provided to the school nurse or secretary **by the first day of school**. Vaccines are available at the Darke County Health Department on Tuesdays from 8-10:30 am and 2-5:00pm. Clinics are walk-in/no appointment needed during these hours. Medicaid and most health insurance are accepted. For more information, questions, or concerns: please call the Health Department at 548-4196 ext. 224. Many of our local doctors also provide vaccines by appointment. Please check with your doctor for more information on this.
