Mr. Shane Mead, Elementary Principal, is pleased with all the good things the students and staff are doing in the Elementary. We had a very successful start to the school year. Several staff members are taking advantage of professional development this nine weeks. Staff in grades kindergarten through second grade will take IMPACT training in math at the Darke County ESC through February. The elementary monthly department meetings focus will be on test prep. April Wulber and Angie McMurry from the Darke County ESC were on campus for test prep professional development in science. Several staff members visited an area school for professional development observations in science, reading and social studies.

Mr. Mead and his staff are looking into Moby Max for grades kindergarten through sixth to possible replace Study Island. This could have potential costs savings to the district.

Mr. Mead shared the kindergarten readiness assessment results. We do have some gaps to close, which will be another topic of discussion during professional development and staff meetings. We are awaiting on county comparisons to see how well we faired against surrounding districts, the KRA2 is a different assessment than used in prior years.

We are currently servicing fifty-two students in the after school intervention classes Monday through Friday.

We are excited that Bradford Special Education Department will be sending five staff members to observe our Intervention Specialists, Angie Thomas and Amanda Pohl. This will be a nice opportunity for them to collaborate with area educators.
