

HEARING AND VISION SCREENING



If your child has glasses, please have them wear them daily for success in school!

October is the month for screening! Kindergarten, 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th, and 11 grade students will have their vision and hearing checked. All new students will also be screened. Referrals will be sent home with students if they do not pass their screening. If you have a concern about your child's vision or hearing, please contact the school nurse.



IMPORTANT HEALTH INFORMATION/COMMUNICATION

Students requiring prescription medication use or treatment while at school must have the Prescribed Medication Administration Form signed by the student's physician and parent. This must be turned in to the school nurse prior to administration at school.

Students requiring over the counter medication use at school must have an Over the Counter Medication Permission Form signed by the parent and turned in to the school nurse prior to being administered at school.

Parents/guardians should notify the school nurse of a student's medical condition (i.e. asthma, allergies, seizure disorders, bleeding disorders, diabetes, etc.) so the proper paperwork can be completed. Diagnosis specific Health Care Plan Forms are available to ensure that the student is treated appropriately in the event of an emergency.
