Pick-up/Drop-off Safety Reminders

This is a courtesy reminder about the pickup and drop off expectations for both before and after school. If you are dropping your student off to start the school day, please use the right hand lane for drop-offs, and feel free to make use of the entire sidewalk area for your student to have access to the building. This will streamline our drop off process, and allow for parents to use

the left lane to exit safely from school property. Please do not drop your student off while utilizing the left lane, as this forces them to cross traffic and hinders the flow of exiting vehicles. Please do not use the left lane to gain access to the right lane. Parents should not use the New
