

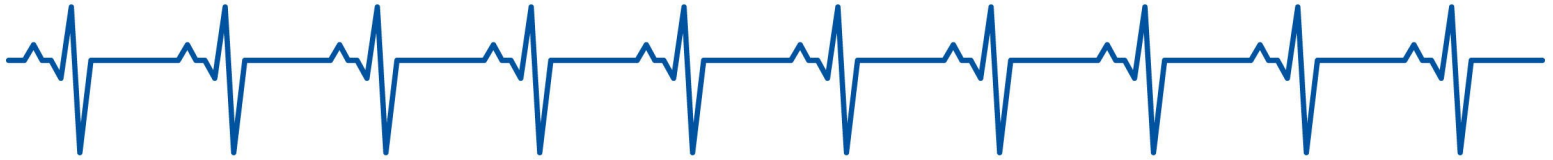

Patriot Activity Center Update

Currently as July 4th, the pre-engineered metal building erection continues to progress. The roofing has been installed over the gymnasium and metal siding has commenced. Meanwhile, masonry crews are wrapping up with columns in the gym as well. Additionally, wood framing crews are nearing completion of the Patriot Activity Center front façade. In the parking lot, sitework is heavily underway with significant completion by mid -August, just in time for the start of the 2022-2023 school year.

Early Learning Center Update

Currently as of July 4th, overhead ceiling inspections continue to move forward as ceiling tiles and flooring will begin next week. All casework and doors are scheduled to be installed in early August which will be followed up with a fresh coat of paint for the Early Learning Center to open its doors on time for the 2022-2023 school year.
